











**Year 7: Unit 3- Theatre in Education**

<p><b>Theatre in Education</b> A style of performance that educates the audience on a serious topic. Also referred to as T.i.E.</p> <div style="border: 1px solid blue; padding: 5px; text-align: center; color: blue; font-weight: bold;">THEATRE IN EDUCATION</div>	<p><b>Statistics/ Facts</b> A technique used in T.i.E that explains facts and statistic about the topic covered in the performance.</p> 	<p><b>Purpose/ Intention</b> The reason a performance is put on. T.i.E's intention and purpose is to educate the audience so they can learn from the message in the story.</p> 	<p><b>Verbatim</b> Using the real words of others in a performance to make it more believable.</p> 
<p><b>Characterisation skills</b> Using your physical skills and vocal skills to play a role</p> 	<p><b>Physical Theatre</b> Using your body to make objects and shapes within a performance.</p> 	<p><b>Flashforward/ Flashback</b> A drama technique where you show something that has happened in the past, or is to happen in the future</p> 	<p><b>Cross Cutting</b> Two scenes on stage at the same time. When one is performing, the other freezes. They take it in turns to perform until the scene is finished not making any contact with each other.</p> 
<p><b>Unison</b> Where a group of people do the same thing at the same time</p> 	<p><b>Slow Motion</b> A drama technique where everyone slows down their action as if the scene is in slow motion. The actors use timing and control to make it look effective.</p> 	<p><b>Marking the Moment</b> Where a scene freezes, and each person steps out of the frame to deliver a thought track within the scene. Once all the actors have done their thoughts, they bring the scene back to life.</p> 	<p><b>Action off stage</b> In T.i.E the actors go off stage to do something dramatic and the actors react as if they can still see. This is to stop the audience from seeing a re-enactment of something horrible such as a death.</p>
